Christmas is a time for giving

All academic authors are used to giving away their articles to publishers - why not give them away to other researchers who may not be able to access or afford to read the journals?

Gifts that keep giving . . .

Research shows that articles made available in this way are cited more often than others - make your research available and get more citations in return.

Wrapping paper and repositories

No need to send out your articles individually: all you need do is to “wrap” them with information on author, title, etc and put them in your local repository - and then everyone will be able to find them.

Everyone is talking about it . . .

You may have seen the major article recently in the Times Higher about the changes afoot in communicating your research. Maybe you are funded by one of the UK research councils: if so, you probably have a grant condition to make your research open access. Maybe you want to raise your impact in advance of the forthcoming REF and want to use open access: the drive for open access is coming from many different directions. Even if a publisher will not let you give the printed pdf, most allow you to release your own, final, version.

Get the widest readership for your articles; make them as useful as they can be; make them open access.
